## HOW DUAL CREDIT COURSES HELP YOU GET AHEAD

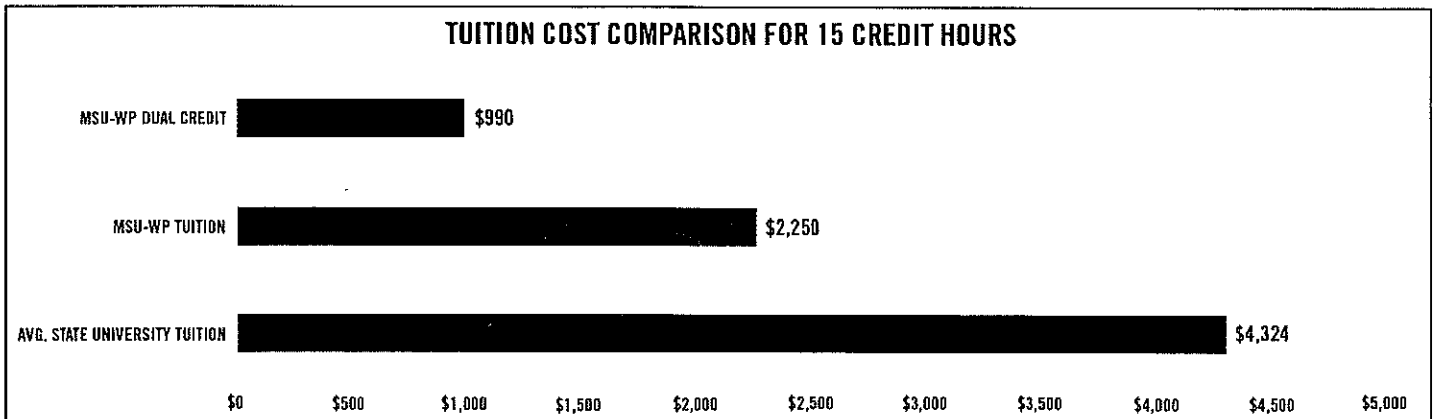
Taking dual credit courses will help you finish your college degree earlier by allowing you to complete many of your general education requirements while still in high school. The general education courses you take will count for credit at both your high school and at Missouri State University-West Plains. Dual credit is an affordable option for starting your college journey.

**\$66** *Pay the per credit hour dual credit rate for your courses*

**50%** *You'll pay 50% less than the cost of the same course taken on campus.*

## FREE AND REDUCED LUNCH SCHOLARSHIP

High school students who receive free and reduced lunches are eligible for a dual credit scholarship. Qualifying students can take one course per semester tuition-free. There is no additional application for this scholarship. Students only need to mark the checkbox on their application form. This will be confirmed with the high school in the normal application process.

## WHAT IS CORE 42?

CORE 42 is the completion of at least 42-semester hours distributed across six knowledge. The goal of the CORE 42 is to facilitate the seamless transfer of academic credits. Individual courses that comprise the CORE 42 are guaranteed to transfer one-to-one among all public (and participating independent) colleges and universities in Missouri.

### Distribution Requirement

Nine (9) credit hours minimum, from at least two (2) disciplines, including at least one civics course.

Six (6) credit hours minimum.

Three (3) credit hours minimum.

Seven (7) credit hours minimum, from at least two (2) disciplines, including one course with a lab

Three (3) credit hours minimum.

Nine (9) credit hours minimum, from at least two (2) disciplines.

*Disciplines are determined by the course prefix.*
